Ft. Walton Beach, Fla. — The Florida Department of Health in Okaloosa County (DOH-Okaloosa) is urging parents and guardians to prepare students for starting or returning to school by reviewing immunization records and start getting the required vaccinations now. To comply with immunization requirements, parents and guardians of students going into kindergarten and 7th grade should take advantage of getting immunizations now to avoid delays and prepare their children for the first day of class.

To avoid the back-to-school rush, visit the DOH-Okaloosa Immunization Clinic as soon as possible. There is not a charge for required immunizations for children up to 18 years of age.
