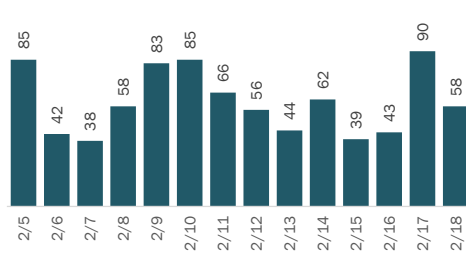

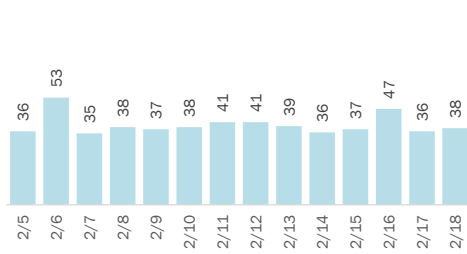

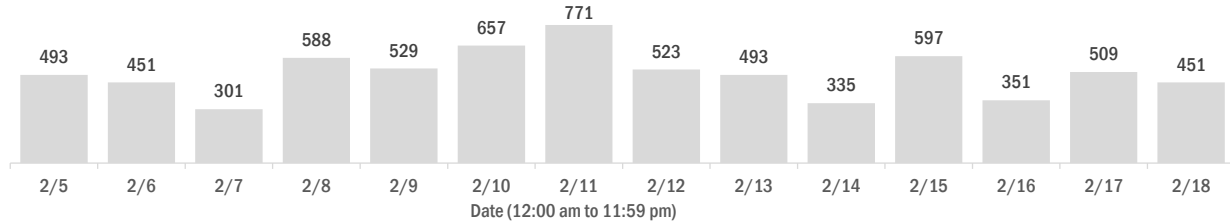

## Laboratory testing for Florida residents over the past 2 weeks

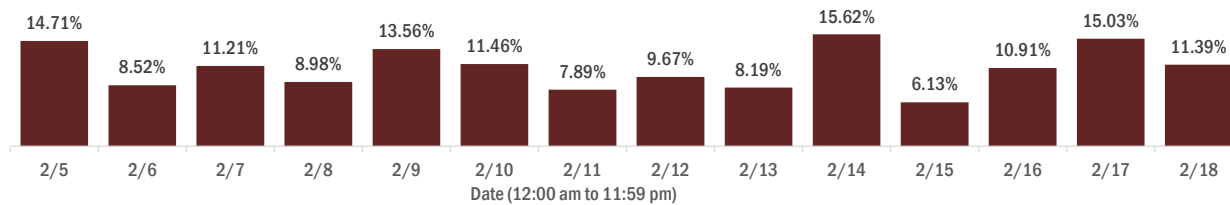
### Number of Florida residents who tested negative per day

These counts include the number of people for whom the Department received negative PCR or antigen laboratory results by day. People who tested negative on multiple days will be included once for each day they are tested. Negative results for persons who have previously tested positive are excluded.

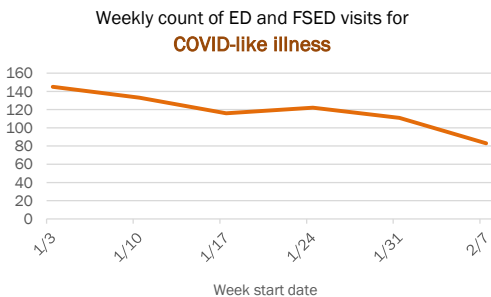
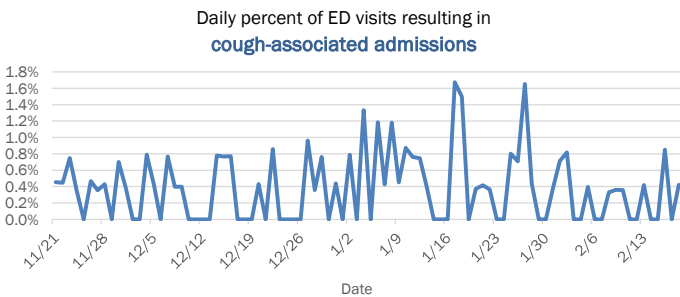
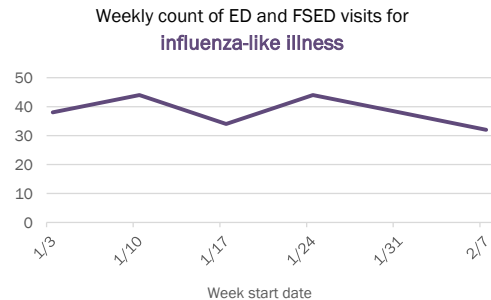
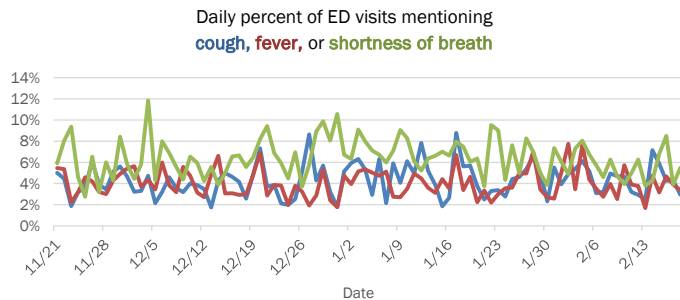


### Percent positivity for new cases in Florida residents

These counts include the number of Florida residents for whom the department received PCR or antigen laboratory results by day. This percent is the number of people who test positive for the first time divided by all the people tested that day, excluding people who have previously tested positive.

The Electronic Surveillance System for the Early Notification of Community-Based Epidemics (ESSENCE-FL) includes chief complaint data from 211 of 211 Florida EDs and 88 of 89 Florida FSEDs. Data are transmitted electronically to ESSENCE-FL daily or hourly.
