Purpose: Engage Okaloosa County community members in a health improvement process through an open, two-way dialogue to reduce the impact of harmful events such as pedestrian injuries, older adult falls, and substance use and to reduce the housing burden.

Opening – Emily Pickens

- Emily Pickens opened the meeting and welcomed attendees.
- Minutes from the April 20, 2023, meeting were reviewed and approved.
- Emily also shared Community Engagement Survey results from the previous meeting.

Action Plan Updates – Robert Bage and JB Whitten National Pedestrian Safety Month: Video Progress

- Chance Leavins met with PIOs across the county to discuss video development. The three videos will focus on the following topics:
 - o Pedestrian and cyclist crosswalk use, filmed in Crestview
 - Pedestrian and cyclist roundabout safety, filmed in Destin
 - o Pedestrian and cyclist safety in school zones, filmed in Fort Walton Beach
- Chance video locations would remain ambiguous but be obvious it is in the county.
 - Chief Bage stated he can assist with blocking off roads as needed for filming. He
 also encouraged the individual cities to be seen in the video.
 - He suggested the school zone filming also show a right turn with the need to stop for a pedestrian or cyclist. He shared many people only look left before making a right turn, and they often miss people approaching from the right side.
 - Captain Fulghum shared pedestrians may be able to react quickly enough to get out of the way, but cyclists have a slower reaction time.

National Pedestrian Safety Month: Marketing Outline

- Mercedes Feris stated she will work with Emily to develop a full marketing outline before the next meeting. Emily will include the DOH-Okaloosa PIO.
- Chief Bage suggested collaborating with a local news station to film a behind the scenes look at the video development and drum up excitement for its release. Mikiko Tucker offered to reach out to her contacts at the stations.

- Katie Scott suggested someone contact Cox for the Beach TV that is shared at local condos and hotels. Emily will request the DOH-Okaloosa PIO reach out.
- Attendees discussed sharing the videos and poster contest information across organizations' social media platforms. Mikiko Tucker shared she will create a media kit including a master tag list and other helpful information.

National Pedestrian Safety Month: School Poster Contest

- Mayor Whitten shared the Superintendent was interested in the event, but wanted to
 ensure schools across the county were invited to participate.
- Emily shared Chance connected her with the OCSD PIO, Catherine Card. She requested guidelines for the poster competition to share across the district.
- Attendees decided to include elementary, middle, and high schools. There will be a
 first-place winner in each age group. They will receive a \$100 gift card and a certificate
 of recognition by local government officials. Posters will be displayed in public buildings
 across the county. Winners will be announced October 17th via social media.
- The poster theme will be "How do you safely walk in your community?".
- Chief Bage suggested the group include homeschooled youth and other youth of school age across the county. The group will spread the word through social media.
 Students not in OCSD can turn in posters to their local library or police department.
 - o Emily will reach out to Vickie with the public library cooperative.

National Pedestrian Safety Month: Walk, Bike, Roll to School Events

- Attendees discussed hosting numerous small events across the county or fewer, larger events with multiple schools. Members determined the group needs to know which schools plan to participate across the county to decide.
- Captain Fulghum will contact the SRO supervisor to ask if they are able to contact their principals to determine which schools will participate this year.
- Attendees discussed the following timeline of events during October:
 - October 2nd press release to launch events and drum up excitement.
 - o October 4th Walk, Bike, Roll to School events and posters due.
 - o October 17th announce poster contest winners via social media.
